| Racism | a belief system or ideology that asserts the inherent superiority of one race over another, leading to discriminatory and prejudiced behaviour based on race. |

| Bullying | repeated aggressive behaviour, intentional harm, or the misuse of power by an individual or a group to target and intimidate others. |
| Bias | a preference or inclination for or against a particular person, group, thing, or idea, often leading to an unfair and unbalanced perspective. |
| Jewish | an individual, community, or cultural identity associated with Judaism, these individuals can be found around the world, and their diversity includes various religious denominations, cultural practices, and historical experiences. |
| Exclusion | the act of deliberately keeping individuals or groups from participating fully in various aspects of social, economic, political, or cultural life based on their perceived racial or ethnic background. |
| Support | actively standing by, advocating for, and offering assistance to an individual experiencing discrimination. |

Stand-up

taking a proactive and assertive stance against discrimination. Actively challenging prejudiced behaviour, bias, or unfair treatment when witnessed.

Differences

the unique characteristics, attributes, or identities that make individuals distinct from one another; discrimination often arises when individuals are unfairly treated based on these.

Similarities

shared characteristics, commonalities, or experiences that individuals may have despite their differences; recognizing these helps build connections and understanding between people, emphasizing our common humanity.

Discrimination

unjust or prejudicial treatment of individuals or groups based on certain characteristics such as race, gender, age, ethnicity, religion, disability, or other factors.

Antisemitism

a form of discrimination, prejudice, or hostility directed against Jews as individuals or as a group.

Prejudice

preconceived opinions or attitudes held about individuals or groups without a fair and reasonable understanding or consideration of the facts; often involves making judgments based on stereotypes, assumptions, or irrational beliefs about a person's characteristics, such as their race, ethnicity, gender, religion, or other distinguishing features.

Stereotypes

Oversimplified and widely held beliefs or ideas about a particular group of people - generalisations that stem from cultural, social, or historical factors and may not accurately reflect the diverse and individual characteristics of the members within the group.
